



Dear Brother Knights & Sister Columbiettes,




I want to first wish you and your families a happy and healthy holiday season and a very joyous new year. I look forward to the day where we can all be together at the hall or at the church where we will not need

January 1st we celebrate: The Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God

The Council of Ephesus (431 A.D.), played host to an important debate in the history of the Church. Was Mary the mother of God? The Greek word for this title was Theotokos.

The Bishop of Constantinople at this time was Nestorius. He argued that Christ was two distinct persons, one being God and the other being man. Nestorius claim was that God put aside being God and became man during the three year ministry of Jesus Christ. After the resurrection, he reverted to being God and ceased to be man. Hence, Nestorius concluded three things: the child born in Bethlehem was not God; the person who died on the cross was not God and Mary was not the mother of God. This, of course, is a heresy.

The Challenger to Nestorius was Cyril, the Bishop of Alexandria. Cyril was a schemer and a dirty politician, while Nestorius was arrogant and intolerant. Cyril argued that if Christ did not come to earth as God, and die and rise as God, then there was no saving action and we are not redeemed. He also argued that God could never put aside his divinity for a time (as when he appeared on earth as man).

It is said that as the Council debated the issue, the people on the street outside shouted, "Theotokos, Theotokos." In the end, the Council affirmed that Mary was the God-bearer, the Theotokos. If Christ was indeed God, then Mary was God's mother.

Our Catholic belief is that the Trinity is three persons: God the Father, God the Son (Jesus Christ), and God the Holy Spirit. One of these persons, God the son, possessed two natures: God (divine nature) and man (human nature). The two natures in Jesus Christ could never be separated.
