#### The full meaning of the Holy Eucharist that calls for a deeper reflection.


There are profound depths in the Holy Eucharist and the sacrifice of the Mass, about which most Catholics are ignorant.

The Holy Eucharist should radically transform your life and lead you into the most intimate depths of union with Christ your savior. At Pentecost the church now celebrates the Holy Eucharist, the Most Blessed Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood, by which He perpetuates His priestly mediation for us who are still in this world, journeying towards eternity. Through the Eucharistic sacrifice made present in the Holy Mass, we are caught up in the mystery of the cross and communicate in Christ's merits and the fruits of His saving Passion.

When our Divine Savior instituted this mystery in view of perpetuating the fruits of His Sacrifice. He said to the apostles, Hoc facite in mean commemorationem, "Do this for a commemoration of Me". Thus, besides the primary object of renewing His immolation and making us participate in it by Communion, Christ desired to make of it, in addition a memorial. And in what way is this mystery a memorial? How does it bring the remembrance of Christ to our hearts?

The Eucharist preserves the remembrance of Jesus, first of all as being a sacrifice.

Certainly, as you know, there is only one sacrifice, total, and perfect, that has paid off and explated everything, that has merited everything, and from which every grace flows: that is the sacrifice of calvary, there is none other. "By one oblation", says St. Paul, "He hath perfected for ever them that are sanctified." But in order that the merits of this sacrifice may be applied to every soul of every time. Christ willed that it should be renewed upon the altar. The altar is another Calvary where the immolation of the cross is commemorated, represented and reproduced. Thus, wherever there is to be found a priest to consecrate the bread and wine, the remembrance of the passion is kept. That which is offered and given upon the altar is the body that was broken for us, the blood which was shared for our salvation. It is the same High Priest, Christ Jesus, who still offers them by the ministry of His priests. Hence how can we fail to think of the passion when we assist at the Sacrifice of the Mass, where all is identical, except the manner in which the oblation is accomplished.

No Mass is celebrated, no communion made without our being enabled to remember that Jesus delivered Himself up to death for the redemption of the world. "For," the thus says St. Paul, "as often as you shall eat this bread, and drink the chalice, you shall shew the death of the Lord, until He come". Thus, is perpetuated, living and fruitful, until the end of time, the remembrance of Christ among those whom He came to redeem by His immolation.
